Dr. David Stricklin Retires



Dr. David Stricklin, professor of history, retired from full-time teaching after 15 years of service at DBU.

Dr. Stricklin earned an M.Div. from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary before going on to complete his Ph.D. from Baylor, focusing on the work of the Texas Baptist Christian Life Commission from 1950-1977. Prior to coming to DBU, he worked for several years with Baptist Student Unions across Texas, including the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor for five years and the University of Texas at Arlington for 11 years.

Dr. Stricklin began serving at DBU as an academic advisor and assistant professor in the College of Adult Education. A few years later, he moved to the College of Humanities and Social Sciences, quickly becoming a student favorite in the history department. While at DBU, he helped to begin Phi Alpha Theta History Honor Society in 2010 and served as its sponsor.

Dr. Stricklin and his wife, Mary Jane (pictured above), have two adult daughters, Dawn, and Debi, who is a DBU graduate, and several grandchildren. Although retired from full-time teaching, Dr. Stricklin will continue to teach as an adjunct for DBU.
